**Rules drafted under Clause 154f read with Clause 154c of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and Sub-section 19(5) of Provincial Councils Act, No. 42 of 1987**

**Rules**

1. These rules shall be imposed to amend the Rules on Procurement Affairs relating to Western Provincial Fund, announced by the *Extraordinary Gazette* No. 2186/25 dated 30th July, 2020 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka.
2. These rules shall be called as Amended Rules on Procurement Affairs relating to Western Provincial Fund.
3. The words; "to Ten Million" stated under first Sub-section in Section 7 of the Rules on Procurement Affairs relating to Western Provincial Fund announced under *Extraordinary Gazette* No. 2186/25 dated 30th July, 2020 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka shall be amended hereby by substitution of the words "to Fifteen Million".
4. In case any inconsistency between the Sinhala, English and Tamil texts of these rules should rise, the Sinhala text shall prevail.
