#### 1. General Qualifications required:

- 1:1 Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Sri Lankan. A "Sri Lankan" is a citizen of Sri Lanka by descent or by registration as defined in the Sri Lanka Citizenship Act.
- 1:2 A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate Examination or equivalent or higher examination, should have a pass in the Senior School Certificate Examination or equivalent or higher examination, should have a pass either in Sinhala language or Tamil language obtained, as the case may be, at the Senior School Certificate Examination or its equivalent if he is either a Sinhalese educated in Sinhala Medium or if he is a Tamil educated in Tamil Medium (This requirement will not apply to those who are in the public service from a date prior to January 01,1961, and who seek appointments to other posts in the public service).
- 1:3 Application from the "New Entrants" Public Officers, who are not either Sinhala or Tamil educated, whose probationary trial appointments have been terminated for failure to pass the prescribed official language proficiency tests will not be entertained unless they have obtained the qualifications which could entitle them to seek exemptions from the highest proficiency test prescribed for the post.

#### 2. Conditions of Service-General:

- 2:1 All officers in the Public Service will be subject to the Financial Regulations, the Establishments Code, Departmental Orders or Regulations and any other Orders or Regulations that may be issued by the Governments from time to time.
- 2:2 A Public officer may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, in such sum and in such manner as the secretary to the Ministry concerned may determine.
- 2:3 A Public Officer may be called upon to serve in any part of the

### ${\bf 3.} \ \ Conditions \ of \ Service \ applicable \ to \ Public \ Officers \ holding \ permanent \ appointments:$

- 3:1 In addition to the conditions referred to in Section 2 above Public Officer holding permanent appointments will be subject to the following further conditions:
- 3:1:1 All appointments will be on probation for a period of 3 years unless a longer period is considered necessary in respect of any post. Any appointment may be terminated at any time during the period of probation without a reason being assigned.
- 3:1:2 All public officers are required to conform to the provisions of the Chapter IV of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and any other laws, regulations or rules that may be made from time to time to give effect to the Language Policy of the Government.
- 3:1:3 All Public officers who have not entered the Public Service either in Sinhala Medium or in Tamil Medium are required to acquire a working knowledge in one of the official languages.
- 3:1:4 Confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation of an officer who entered the Public Service in a medium other than Sinhala or Tamil will depend, inter alia, on the passing of the Grade 1 Proficiency Test in one of the Official Languages within one year; Grade II Proficiency Test within two years, and Grade III Proficiency Test (where applicable) within three years from the date of appointment.

Faliure to pass a test within the prescribed period will result in the suspension of increments. Suspension will be converted to a stoppage if the test is not passed within a further period of six months beyond the prescribed period such stoppage operating until the test is passed or until such time as the provisions of Section 3:1:6 below apply.

- 3:1:5 Such officers should, on receiving appointment, be given facilities on full pay, for a period of 6 months to obtain proficiency in one of the official languages. He will thereafter, be required to sit the relevant proficiency examination and if he does not pass he will be given the opportunity to pass the examination within a period of 2 years immediately after the period of 6 months on full pay, while he performs his normal duties.
- 3:1:6 If he fails to pass the examination in this prescribed period of 2 1/2 years his services will be terminated.
- 3:1:7 A Public Officer already confirmed in permanent post in the Public Service will not normally be required to serve the period of probation on being appointed to another permanent post in the Public Service. Such Officers may in the first instance be appointed to act in

the new post for a specified period with a view to testing him in his new post.

3:1:8 Selected candidates (Other than those already holding permanent or temporary appointments in the Public Service) who have already been medically examined will be required to undergo a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer to test their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

#### 4. Terms of Engagement:

- 4:1 Public officers appointed to permanent and pensionable posts should contribute to the 'Widows and Orphans' Pension Scheme from their salary an amount equivalent to the percentage the Government requires to recover from their salary.
- 4:2 Public officers appointed to permanent or temporary posts on Provident Fund basis will be required to contribute 6% of their consolidated salary to the Public Service Provident Fund. The Government will contribute as its share of contributions an amount equal to 150% of the compulsory contributions credited to the fund at the close of the Financial Year.
- 4:3 Officers who hold pensionable appointments in the Public Service and who are released for appointments to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service and those officers in the Local Government Service who hold pensionable appointments and who are released for appointments to pensionable posts in the Public Service will be allowed pensionability in their posts in the Local Government Service and Public Service respectively.
- 4:4 Regular Force personnel in the Army, Navy and Air Force who are released for appointments to posts in the Public Service which are pensionable under the Minutes on Pension will be allowed pensionability in their posts in the Public Service. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Minutes the unforefeited full pay service of any member of the Armed Forces who is released to accept an appointment as a Public Officer in a post which has been declared to be pensionable under these Minutes shall be reckoned for the purpose of any pension or gratuity payable under these Minutes.

#### 5. Serving Officers in the Public Service:

- 5:1 Applications from officers of the Public Service who possess all the necessary qualifications must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from Public Officers holding post in the permanent establishment in the Public Service. Heads of Departments in forwarding such applications should state whether the applicants could be released or not to take up the new appointment, if selected.
- 5:2 Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.
- 5:3 Anyone desiring to recommended a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or any attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidates.
- 5:4 Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.
- 5:5 Application not conforming in every respect with the requirements of the advertisement will be rejected.

#### 6. Definition of Salary for the purpose of Eligibility

6:1 Salary for purposes of eligibility means only the consolidated salary and does not include any action salary, allowances etc.

#### 7. New National Policy on Recruitment and Promotions:

Recruitment and Promotion in the Public Service, Provincial Public Service, Public Corporate Sector and Companies fully owned by the Government will be done in accordance with the policy laid down in the Public Administration Circulars No. 15/90 of 09.03.1990, 15/90 (I) of 25.03.1990 & 15/90 (II) of 15.06.1990 with effect from 01.01.1990 subject to amendments that will be done by subsequent Public Administration Circulars.

#### Rules and Instructions for Candidates

"All candidates are bound to act in conformity with the provisions of the Examinations Act, No. 25 of 1968."

All candidates are bound to abide by the rules given below. A candidate who violates any of these rules is liable to one or more of the following punishments at the discretion of the Commissioner of Examinations:—

Suspension from the whole or part of the examination or one

subject or a part thereof;
Disqualification from one subject or from the whole examination;
Debarment from appearing for an examination for a period of

(iii) Debarment from appearing for an examination for a period of one year or two years;
(iv) Debarment for life;
(v) Suspension of the certificate for a specified period;
(vi) Reporting the candidate's conduct to his Superiors or handing over the candidate to the Police or making a complaint to the Police over his action.

The Commissioner reserves, himself the right to take action at any

The Commissioner reserves himself the right to take action at any time before the Examination or at any stage of it or thereafter, and his decision shall be deemed final. In the case of examinations for recruitment to the Public Service, the decision of Commissioner of Examinations shall be subject to the Supervision of the Public Service Commission.

1. All candidates should conduct themselves in a quiet manner in and around the Examination Hall so as not to disturb or obstruct the Supervisor, his assistants or the other candidates. They should enter

and leave the Examination Hall as quietly as possible.

2. Candidates should obey the Supervisor. Therefore, when the Examination is in progress and before the commencement of the Examination as well as immediately after the end of the Examination they should act in accordance with the instructions of the Supervisor and his assistants.

Under no circumstances whatsoever will a candidate be allowed into the Examination Hall after the lapse of half an hour after the commencement of a paper. No candidate will be permitted to leave the hall till after half an hour from the time of commencement of the paper. Candidates who come late for Practical and Oral Examinations are liable to be refused admission.

4. Every candidate should sit at the desk bearing his/her index number and not at any other desk. Unless with the permission of the supervisor no candidate should change his/her seat. The occupation of a seat other than the one assigned to him by a candidate is liable to be considered as an act with a dishonest intention.

5. Absolute silence should be maintained in the Examination Hall.

A candidate is forbidden to speak to, communicate with or have dealings with any person within or outside the Examination Hall other than a member of the Examination Hall Staff. If there is an urgent need for a candidate to communicate with another, prior permission must be obtained from the supervisor.

6. A candidate's answer script is identified only by the Index Number

and his/her name should not be written on the answer script. Another candidate's index number appearing on the answer script of a candidate is considered as an attempt to commit a dishonest act. Answer scripts bearing an index number that is difficult to decipher is liable to be

rejected.
7. Candidates should write only on the paper provided and should not write anything on the blotting paper, question paper, desk or any other place. Non conformity with this rule could be taken as an act with dishonest intentions.

8. Any paper or answer book supplied should not be torn up, crushed, solute to the same of the same out. Failure to abide by these requirements may be considered as an

attempt to cheat.

9. When answering questions in Mathematics the submission of with no working at all and in correct answers with incorrect working or with no working at all and in art if the work of art is similar or very close in resemblance to that of another candidate in concept, in form or in execution it is liable to be considered as a disherent cet.

10. The removal of any paper or stationery supplied to candidates out of the Examination Hall is prohibited. All such material remains the property of the Commissioner of Examinations. Breach of this rule shall be liable to be considered an act with dishonest intention.

11. While in the Examination Hall a candidate should not have with him or near him any book, note book, pocket note book, exercise book, sheet of paper or pieces of paper other than the stationery supplied to him. Nor should any handbag, travelling bag or parcel other than the candidate's boxes of colours and boxes of instruments where necessary or any file cover, card board pad, folded newspapers, brown papers should be brought into the Examination Hall. Breach of this rule papers should be brought into the Examination Hall. Breach of this rule is a punishable act.

12. A candidate is strictly forbidden to keep with him any book, note book or a sheet of paper with written notes once inside the Examination Hall. Should the Supervisor so requires, each candidate is bound to declare everything he has with him/her. Breach of this

Examination Hall. Should the Supervisor so requires, each candidate is bound to declare everything he has with him/her. Breach of this requirement shall be considered as an attempt to commit an act of dishonesty.

13. Candidates are forbidden to copy or attempt to copy from the answer script of another candidate, a book, paper containing notes or any other source. A candidate should not attempt to look at the answer script of any another candidate. A candidate should refrain from helping another Candidate and also from getting help from another candidate or a person. Every completed answer sheet should be kept underneath the sheet on which the answer is being written. Sheets of writing paper should not be strewn all over the desk.

14. A candidate will under no circumstance whatsoever be allowed to leave the Examination Hall even for a brief period during the course of the paper. However in an emergency if a candidate needs to leave the hall, he/she shall be allowed to do under the surveillance of the supervisor or his assistant. He/she shall be subject to search before leaving the hall as well as before re-entering it.

15. Impersonation while answering a paper or before the commencement of the Examination is a punishable offence. Tampering with identity cards, presenting false identity cards or tampering with someone's identity are also such offences. Candidates are warned not to commit such offences.

16. Assistance given to a candidate in a dishonest manner by a person who is not a candidate, is considered a serious offence.

Candidates should adhere to the following instructions for

Candidates should adhere to the following instructions for their own safety:

(i) Be at the Examination Hall well in time. It is sufficient to be at the Examination Hall 10 or 15 minutes before the commencement of each paper. If you have any doubt as to the location of the Examination Hall, make inquiries on a day prior to the date of Examination and be sure of its location.

(ii) In case of any doubt regarding your entry for a paper or eligibility to sit a paper you should bring it to the notice of the Supervisor and get your doubts cleared. Failure to do so may result in your candidature for the subject being cancelled.

(iii) When appearing for the Examination, candidates should produce their identity cards at every paper they sit. If a candidate fails to produce identification documents at the Examination Hall, his candidature is liable to be cancelled. In case a candidate forgets to bring such documents into the Examination Hall, it should be brought to the notice of the Supervisor and arrangements should be made to produce

(iv) Standard stationery (i.e. writing paper, graph paper, ledger paper, precis paper) will be supplied. If you receive any stationery that is different from the kind generally distributed or distributed to thothers it should be promptly brought to the notice of the supervisor. No paper other than those issued at the Examination Hall should be used for answering questions. Excess paper and other material should be left on the desk, in good condition. When log tables are supplied they should be used with care and left on the desk when you leave.

confusion

confusion.

(viii) You should read carefully the instructions given at the head of the question paper, with regard to the compulsory questions and the manner in which the other questions should be selected. Disregard to these instructions is often liable to affect you adversely.

(ix) When Mathematics Questions are answered, give all details of calculations and any roughwork, in their serial order as part of the working of the problem. Necessary sketches, diagrams and figures should be accurate and sufficiently large. In an answer running into serveral pages if reference must be made to a diagram drawn in an earlier page, that diagram should be drawn repeatedly.

(x) At the end of each paper, arrange your answer sheets in the order you answered the questions. Then using the piece of twine supplied, tie them up at the top left hand corner.

hand corner.

(xi) You should personally handover your answer script to the Supervisor or to an Invigilator. Or else remain in your seat till it is collected. Failure to do so may result in the loss of your script and your being treated as an absentee for the paper. On no account should your script be handed over to a peon or an attendant.

(xii) If it becomes necessary for you to speak to the Supervisor or an Invigilator, or if you need stationery, remain in your seat and raise your hand.

APPLICATIONS are invited from citizens of Sri Lanka both males and females with the qualifications stipulated hereunder, for the posts of Prison Guards, vacant in the Department of Prisons.

- 02. Number of vacancies and filling of vacancies:

- 6.2 Prison Guards who are liable to serve in any prisons throughout the Island are required to reimburse all expenses incurred on training, if they vacate the initial period of training or compulsory service period not exceeding 10 years.

#### $6.0\ \textit{Procedure for Selection of Trainees for Year 2012}:$

#### 6.1 Basis of Selection:

- 6.1.1 The number of trainees to be admitted will be decided based on the teacher carder requirements in the school system in the year 2015.
- 6.1.2 The basis of selection will be the Z score obtained at G. C. E. (A/L) Examination in 2010. Student will be selected for English/Information Communication Technology and Physical Education Courses on the achievements and performances

of Proficiency Selection . Tests/Sports in case of obtaining the same mark in Proficiency Test or Performance of Sports, by two or more applicants, the results obtained at the G. C. E. (O/L) at the first sitting will be considered. Marks will be awarded as 04 marks for a Distinction pass, 03 marks for a Very Good pass, 02 marks for a Credit pass and 01 mark for an Ordinary pass and the available number of vacancies will be filled based on the total number of marks obtained. The award of these marks will be limited only for 08 main subjects. Selection for all courses will be 30% on National Level and 70% on Difficult District Level except for Sri Pada National College of Education and except for Primary Education Course offered National Colleges of Education. For the primary Education Corse, selection will be 50% on National Level and 50% on Difficult District Level except for Sri Pada National College of Education.

- 6.1.3 Applicants who prefer to follow English Medium Coruses Western Music and Information Communication Technology and Sinhala/Tamil Medium Business and Accounting Course should qualify with a Credit pass in the English Language or an Ordinary Pass for English Literature. Applicants for English Language Course should have obtained a very good pass in English Language or Credit Pass in English Literature at G. C. E. (O/L) Examination including six core subjects with Sinhala/Tamil language and Mathematics.
- 6.1.4 Applicants should reach a satisfactory level at the Practical Test conducted for Physical Education and Western Music.

#### 6.2 Difficult District Basis:

6.2.1 Admission for difficult districts will be made from applicants belonging to the 17 districts deemed as difficult based on the distribution of educational facilities. (Matale, Mullativu, Anuradhapura, Nuwara Eliya, Vavuniya, Polonnaruwa, Hambantota, Trincomalee, Badulla, Jaffna, Batticaloa, Moneragala, Kilinochchi, Ampara, Ratnapura, Mannar, Puttalam).

Number to be admitted from each district will be decided for each course proportional to the number of students appeared for G. C. E. (A/L) - 2010 Examination in all media in respective districts.

- 6.2.2 If the expected number from relevant difficult district is not available, vacancies will be filled from other districts.
- 6.2.3 Determination of Districts:
  - 6.2.3.1 The district of any school applicant will be the district of the location of the school/schools in which he/she had studied during the entire or major part of the Five years (more than 2 1/2 years) period ending on the last day of the month immediately preceding the month in which he/she had sat the G. C. E. (A/L) examination at the first sitting.
  - 6.2.3.2 If any private applicant had left the school after having previously sat the G. C. E. (A/L) examination as a school applicant, his/her district will be the district of the location of the school from which he/she had first sat the above examination.
  - 6.2.3.3 If any private applicant has left the school without having previously sat for the G. C. E. (A/L) examination as a school candidate, his/her district will be the district of the location of the school/schools in which he/she had studied during the entire or the major part of the five years (more than 2 1/2) years period ending on the last day of the month immediately preceding the month in which he/she had sat the G. C. E. (A/L) examination at the first sitting.
  - 6.2.3.4 If any private applicant has not studied in a School, he/she should confirm his/her district of residence with the voter's list of Election Commissioners Office or Grama Niladhari and Divisional Secretary's affidavit.
- 6.3 Selection for Sri Pada National College of Education:
  - 6.3.1 75% of the vacancies will be filled from applicants of the Indian Tamil Origin and 25% from Sinhalese applicants.
    - 6.3.1.1 On the required number of vacancies prevailing at State-schools in plantation districts, 35% of the candidates will be appointed to the Moneragala, Badulla and Ratnapura Districts.
  - 6.3.2 75% will be selected to Tamil Medium Courses while 25% will be selected to Sinhala Medium Courses.
  - 6.3.3 Primary, Mathematics and Science Courses will be conducted in the Sinhala Medium whereas Information Communication Technology Course, in the English Medium. Primary, Mathematics, Science, Music (Carnatic),

Dance (Bharatha) and First Language (Tamil), Social Science Courses will be conducted in the Tamil Medium. (These courses will be offered at Sri Pada National College of Education.).

- 6.3.4 6.3.4.1 Applications for admission to Sri Pada National College of Education will be entertained only from children whose parents are residenes employed in the plantation sector in Nuwara Eliya, Kandy, Matale, Badulla, Moneragala, Ratnapura, Kegalle, Kalutara, Matara, Galle and Kurunegala Plantation Districts. Priority is given to children of the workers who work at present.
  - 6.3.4.2 In case of insufficient number of children of the estate workers as applicants from the estate sector, applications from those of the estate workers who worked at least 05 years after 2001 will be considered although they are not employed at the moment. (Priority is given sequentially as 2010, 2009, 2008.)
  - 6.3.4.3 In case of insufficient number of children, of the estate workers as applicants from the above districts for Tamil Medium, applicants those who are not children of employees in the plantation sector but Indian Origin live in above mentioned Districts, will be considered.
  - 6.3.4.4 In case of insufficiency of qualified applicants from plantation districts, Tamil Medium applicants who are from other districts with Indian Origin will be considered.
  - 6.3.4.5 Tamil medium Indian Origin applicants those who live in Plantation Districts and other districts should have passed in three subjects at G. C. E. (A/L) Examination.
  - 6.3.4.6 In case of insufficient number of Sinhala Medium applicants from Plantation Districts, the rest of the vacancies will be filled from those who applied for the same course in other National Colleges of Education.

    The basis of the selection will be the Z-score.
- 6.3.5 At the interview the children of the employees in the State and Private Sector Estate Companies should submit a letter from the Estate Superintendent relating to service (indicating employee's period of service) that he is permanently serving for the past period of 05 years or more/retirement from the plantation sector (indicating year and date clearly). Candidate's letter agreeing to serve a period of ten (10) years continuously in the schools in the plantation sector after the training and letters to prove that deductions are being done for the Employees Provident Fund including Registration Numbers. Paragraph 6.2.2 will be applied for the applicants of Sri Pada National College of Education when deciding district of applicants.
- 6.3.6 In selection, at least one applicant will be considered for each relevant district.

*Note*: In the case of an applicant having an Indian Tamil Origin who had studied in Sinhala Medium will be considered for the percentage entitled to Indian Tamil Origin. Similarly, a Sinhalese applicant who had studied in Tamil Medium will be considered for the Sinhala medium percentage.

#### 7.0 Other Matters related to Selection:

- 7.1 Selected applicants should be prepared to submit acceptable evidence and originals of certificates to confirm their eligibility on the date of conducting the interview. A number of applicants more than the number of vacancies will be called for the interview.
- 7.2 Applicants who fail to submit the originals of all certificates will not be considered.
- 7.3 When a problematic situation is observed relating to the mental and physical fitness required by an applicant for reaching the expected level in the Course and the Interview Board is not satisfied of this position he/she should be subjected to a special interview and after the submission of this report to the Colleges of Education Board the decision taken by the Board should be implemented.
- 7.4 If the selected applicant fails to get registered in the relevant College of Education within 03 days from the due date, he/she will be deprived of the opportunity for the admission. The vacancies created thereby, will be filled according to the merit order. Appeals from the applicants who fails to register within 03 days from the due date will strictly not be considered.
- 7.5 Selected applicants are required to appear for a Medical Examination before their admission to a College of Education to ascertain whether they are physically and mentally fit for service in any part of the island.

- 7.6 After the admission to any Course/National College of Education permission will not be granted to change such Course/College of Education. If a sufficient number of applicants are not available for a particular Course the applicants will be transferred to the nearest College of Education where such Courses are conducted.
- 7.7 In selecting applicants for a Course, if the number of applicants who have obtained equivalent Z Score at the G. C. E. (A/L) is in excess of the number of vacancies available, the results obtained by the applicants at the G. C. E. (O/L) at the first sitting will be considered. Marks will be awarded as 04 marks for a Distinction pass, 03 marks for a Very Good pass, 02 marks for a Credit pass and 01 mark for an ordinary pass and the available number of vacancies will be filled based on the total number of marks obtained. The award of these marks will be limited only for 08 main subjects.
- 8.0 Persons who are not eligible to apply or to get admitted:
  - 8.1 Those who have already obtained teaching appointments in Government or in Private Schools.
  - 8.2 Those who have been selected for an appointment in a Government School.
  - 8.3 Those who are following or who have followed a Course in a College of Education.
  - 8.4 Those who are following or have followed a Degree Course in a University or University Institute or any other Higher Education Institute where G. C. E. (A/L) is the entry requirement. (After publishing the *gazette* notification students who were/are withdrawn the registration will not be eligible to apply/to get admitted).
  - 8.5 Those who have been discontinued from a College of Education on disciplinary ground.

#### 9.0 Conditions applicable for Training:

- 9.1 Duration of a Training Course is three years. This period consists of two years residential institutional training in the National College of Education and one year internship training while being attached to a school. Attendance of a student teacher should be not less than 90% to enable him/her to sit for the External Final Examination conducted by the Department of Examinations at the end of the second year.
- 9.2 Every trainee should pass the Internal Continuous Tests held in the first and the second year, Internal Test conducted at the end of the second year and the external final examination conducted by the Department of Examinations. Except, those who follow English Courses all those who follow other Courses should pass in the English subject at the above examinations. Applications should be forwarded only by those who agree to the above conditions.
- 9.3 During the period of two years residential training a trainee will be provided with meals and lodging facilities to the value of Rs. 2,500 per month for ten months in a year. During the Internship year a monthly allowance of Rs. 3,000 will be paid for ten months. Other expenses for personal requirements should borne by the trainee.
- 9.4 During the period of training, a trainee will not be allowed to follow an Academic Course as an internal student in a University, University Institution or other Higher Education Institute where G. C. E. (A/L) is treated as the entry requirement. If it is proved that a trainee had followed such a Course amount of the Bond and Agreement Rs. 500,000 incurred for him/her will be surcharged and the trainee will be removed from the Course.
- 9.5 The clergy of any religion should make Bond and agreement with the Ministry of Education on at least 5 years service without being disrobed. If the trainees get married during the period of training their studentship will be cancelled.
- 9.6 If a trainee fails to exhibit the progress expected in his general conduct, enthusiasm and in his studies during the period of training he will be removed from training. Likewise, those who do not reach a satisfactory level in the assessment during the first year of academic training or found to be following any other Course in an Institute as indicated at 9.4 they will be removed from the Course. Regarding these matters the decision made by the Colleges of Education Board shall be the final decision.
- 9.7 If any complaints are received relating to the physical and mental fitness of the trainee either by the President of the College during the period of training or by the Principal of the school during the Internship period the trainee will be referred to a Special Interview Board. A final decision will be taken after the submission of This report to the Colleges of Education Board.
- 9.8 National Diploma in Teaching will be awarded to the trainees who will successfully complete the Training Course. Course Work and Personality Development (inclusive of compulsory co-curricular activities) will be continuously assessed during the period of training and this assessment will form a component of the final assessment in awarding the Diploma.

- 9.9 Applicants successfully completing this Course will be considered for grant of appointments as teachers based on the availability of vacancies on Education Zonal Level in difficult districts.
  - 9.9.1 In future priority will be given to those who complete this Training Course in awarding teaching appointments for Government Schools. Therefore, the candidates who are invited for the interviews for selecting to the above Course should appear for the interview only if would agree to the above conditions.
  - 9.9.2 Priority is given to those who will follow these training courses in appointing teachers to Government Schools. Therefore, candidates should appear for the interviews if only they can adhere to the conditions mentioned above.
  - 9.9.3 Applicants who receive their training under the above conditions should enter into Bond and Agreement with the Secretary of the Ministry of Education that they will serve under the Ministry of Education for a minimum period of five (5) years from the date of appointment in the district selected for National College of Education they have been appointed. The Education Zone for which the appointment has been given will not be changed for any reason.
- 9.10 Applicants who get registered in a National College of Education should sign a Bond and Agreement for Rs. 500,000 for the cost to be incurred for providing training and for supply of infrastructure facilities. A student who leave the Course half way or who fail to serve for five years under the Government will be subjected to a condition for paying the total amount in the Bond and Agreement to the Government.
- 9.11 If any applicant claims to change the selected National College of Education on medical/personal reasons will not be eligible for admission.
- 9.12 All educational and other qualifications should have been completed on or before the last date of calling for applications.

#### $10.0\ Application:$

- 10.1 An applicant can apply for a maximum of 03 courses. If applied for the same course in two media, it is considered as applied for two courses. Such applicant can apply only for one more course. Buddhist monks should apply for the Course of Buddhism whereas the clergy of Christianity, Hinduism and Islam for their respective courses of religions.
- 10.2 An applicant can enclose only one application and two of its certified copies in the same envelope. If any applicant has submitted applications other than the above mentioned application and the two certified copies all the applications will be rejected.
- 10.3 Application should be prepared according to the Specimen Form and instructions given below.
- 10.4 Applications should be sent under Registered Post and addressed to Chief Commissioner (Teacher Education), Colleges of Education Branch, Ministry of Education, Isurupaya, Battaramulla to be received on or before 15.07.2011.

- 10.8 No other document should be attached to the application.
- 10.9 If any certificate submitted by the candidate is revealed later to be a forged or fraudulent certificate, the candidate will be dismissed from service and he will be ineligible for any post in Public Service.
- 11.0 Regarding any problems arising with regard to the above information in this *Gazette* Notification the decision of the Colleges of Education Board will be the final decision.

APPLICATIONS are hereby called from the qualified citizens of Sri Lanka for the Special open Competitive examination for recruitment to fill the vacancies in class III of Sri Lanka Administrative Service for North and East Provinces.

- In this notice "Secretary" means the "Secretary to the Ministry of Public Administration and Home affairs" "Service" means the "Sri Lanka Administrative Service".
- Date of Examination. This examination will be held in Colombo in October 2011 by Commissioner General of Examinations. The Secretary reserves the right to postpone or cancel this examination subject to instructions given by the Public Service Commission/ Cabinet of Ministers.

*Written Examination.*— The Examination will consist of the following question papers.

- (i) General Intelligence,
- (ii) Essay and Precis,
- (iii) General Knowledge,
- (iv) Aptitude for Management.

Oral Test.— The Secretary will decide the date for interview for the candidates who sat for all the papers in the written examination and obtained a higher aggregate of marks as determined by the Public Service Commission/Cabinet of Ministers as sufficient.

- 3. Number of persons to be appointed and effective date of appointment will be determined as per the orders of the Public Service Commission/Cabinet of Ministers. Public Service Commission/Cabinet of Ministers shall reserve the powers to fill a certain number of vacancies or to refrain from filling all the number of vacancies.
- 4. Conditions of Service: A selected candidate will be appointed to Class III of the Service on the general conditions governing appointments in the Public Service and on the terms and conditions set out in the Minute of the Service dated 28th October, 2005, (Published in the Gazette Extraordinary of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka No. 1419/3 of 14th November, 2005) and subject to any amendments made or to be made hereafter to the Minute.
  - 4.1 Number of the vacancies in North and East Provinces filled by this examination is 46.
  - 4.2 Selected candidates are bounded to serve in North and East provinces for a minimum period of 10 years from the date of appointment. If they fail to do so, action shall be taken to terminate their service.

The appointments through this examination will be made to the Class III of the Sri Lanka Administrative Service.

- 6. Health and Character.— A candidate must satisfy the Secretary that he is duly qualified in respect of health and that he has an excellent moral character. He/she must possess good eye sight and be physically fit for service in any part of the island. Selected candidates will be called upon to undergo a medical examination.
  - 7. Eligibility:- A candidate appearing for this must:-
    - (i) be a citizen of Sri Lanka;
    - (ii) Have obtained a degree from a university recognized by the University Grants Commission;
      - (a) The effective date of the certificate of degree should be 25.07.2011 or a date prior to that.
    - (iii) have followed the degree in Tamil medium or have studied Tamil language as a subject of the degree or have sat for the Subject of Tamil Language at G. C. E. (A/L);
    - (iv) Not have reached 28 years of age as at 25.07.2011;
    - (v) have a sound moral character and be physically fit;
    - (vi) no person ordained in any religious sect shall be permitted to sit this examination.

#### Note:-

- (i) No person is allowed to sit the competitive examination for recruitment to Sri Lanka Administrative service for more than two sittings as per 5(1) or 5(2) of Sri Lanka Administrative Service Minute.
- (ii) Requisite qualifications for this examination should have been completed in every aspect by 25.07.2011

8. Examination Fee: The fee is Rs.1,000. It should be paid before the closing date of applications at any District Secretariat/Divisional Secretariat to be credited to Revenue Head 2003-02-13. The receipt obtained from the District Secretariat/Divisional Secretariat should be pasted in the relevant cage of the application form. This fee is non-refundable, it is advisable to keep a photocopy of the receipt with the candidates.

#### 9. Method of Application:-

- (a) The application should be in the form of the specimen appended to this notification and should be prepared by the candidate himself on paper of size 8 1/2" x 12" (A 4) using both sides. It should be specially noted that the application forms should be prepared that cages 1.0 to 2.0 apper on the first side of the paper and rest of the cages apper in the other side of the paper. Applications that do not comply with the specimen and that are not completed in every aspect, shall be rejected without notice. The words "Special Open Competitive Examination for Recruitment to fill the vacancies in class III of Sri Lanka Administrative Service for North and East Provinces - 2011" should be clearly indicated on the top left-hand corner of the envelope enclosing the application. Any application received after the closing date will not be accepted. When preparing the application, it is essential to mention the name of examination in Tamil language as well as, in English language.
- (d) Candidate's signature in the application form should have been attested by a Principal of a Government School, a justice of Peace, Commissioner of Oaths, Attorney-at-Law, Notary Public, Commissioned Officer in the Armed Forces, and officer holding a gazetted post in the Police Service or an Officer holding a permanent post in public service whose annual inital salary is more than Rs. 240,360.
- (e) Any application, which is not completed in every aspect, is liable to be rejected. No complaint that an application has been lost or delayed in post will be considered.
- (f) Receipt of applications will not be acknowledged. A notice will be published in the newspapers by the Department

of Examinations as soon as admission cards are issued to applicants. If the admission card is not received even after 2 or 3 days of such an advertisement, steps should be taken to notify the Department of Examinations in the manner specified in the advertisement. #### 10. Admission to the Examination:-

- (a) The Commissioner General of Examinations will issue admission cards to all persons whose applications have been received. A candidate presenting himself for the examination must produce his admission card to the supervisor of the examination center. A candidate who fails to produce his admission card will not be permitted to sit the examination.
- (b) A candidate must sit the examination at the examination hall assigned to him. Every candidate must get his signature attested in advance and hand over the admission card to the supervisor on the first day he presents himself for the examination. A set of rules to be observed by all candidates is published on this gazette. Candidates are subjected to rules and regulations imposed by the Commissioner General of Examinations on conducting the examination and they are liable to be subjected to a punishment imposed by him/her for breach of these rules.
  - Note.— The issue of an admission card to a candidate does not mean that he or she has fulfilled the requisite qualifications to sit the examination.

     (iii) General Knowledge Duration: 2 hours 100 marks
     (iv) Aptitude for Management Duration: 2 hours 100 marks

Candidates should sit all the question papers.

Oral Test (25 Marks)

Candidates who have sat all the question papers of the written exam and qualified themselves shall be called for the oral test. Only the candidates who have scored 40% of marks or above for each of the papers and scored an aggregate of marks above the level determined as sufficient by the Public Service Commission/Cabinet of Ministers according to the number of vacancies existing shall be called for the interview. if there are a sufficient number of candidates who possess above qualifications, a number equivalent to twice the number of vacancies shall be called for the oral test. (The scheme of allocating marks shall be approved by the Appointing Authority/ Public Service Commission at the early stage of recruitment.)
